### 9. REPORTS

9.1 Budget utilization report:

Alan Rice

Mr. Rice presented the Board of Education a report on year-to-date operating expenditures compared to budget and prior year. Expenditures to date are below budget but are greater than the prior year for the same time-period, which is mainly due to an increase in salaries and benefits, TTOC replacement costs, District Day, Pro D, and travel. Mr. Rice responded to questions.

9.2 District principals and vice principals:

Steve Wyer

Mr. Wyer provided the Board of Education an update on the initiatives of the district principals and vice principals. The main operational strategies presented included: antiracism strategy; reporting policy and district initiatives committee; grade 4-7 numeracy leaders; book clubs; grade 8 and 9 numeracy assessment; school based team growth; early

learning framework and play today; fall literacy assessment, analysis and strategy; performance-based literacy assessment; phonological awareness; and learning services. The district principals and vice principals are very busy, however, they find time to collaborate and overlap their projects. None of them operates in isolation and the team has built strong working relationships.

- 9.3 Rocky Mountain International School enrollment: Danielle Warren Ms. Warren provided the Board of Education an update on RMISP enrollment. She noted that a shortfall between projected FTE for 2022-23 for the RMISP program, and the current FTE for 2022-23 which is leading to a variance of 17 FTE between the projected and actual FTE. The program is estimating to break-even for 2022-23 as well as providing the District with approximately \$208,000 for the annual cost recovery of the program.
- 9.4 BC School Trustees Association:

  Trustee Thurgood Sagal reported to the Board of Education in four areas: She reported that there is a new Minister of Education, the Honourable Rachna Singh, and Minister of State for Child Care, Honourable Grace Lore. She discussed the orientation session and reminded Trustees of the motion building deadline of January 25. She also noted that the BCSTA Board of Directors have interim vice president. She is seeking input from Trustees on who to vote for.
- 9.5 BC School Trustees Association, Kootenay Boundary Branch (KBB): Rhonda Smith Trustee Smith discussed the motion building deadline and the proposed motion that is being put forward by School District No. 8 (Kootenay Lake) regarding public private partnerships for new school infrastructure.
- 9.6 BC Public Schools Employers' Association: Scott King
  Trustee King shared that BCPSEA AGM will be held on January 26 and 27, 2023 in
  Vancouver. This upcoming AGM will see BCPSEA Board Nominations for the Northern
  Interior and Metro Regions. Trustee King has distributed several BCPSEA documents and
  will be participating in a BCPSEA meeting via Zoom on January 11 to review the proposed
  budget and financial information, as well as the AGM processes.
