



POLICY 2400

ACQUISITION AND DISPOSAL OF PROPERTY

POLICY:

The Board of Education (“Board”) believes that every effort should be made, prior to acquiring an asset, to consider the environmental impacts of the purchase including the environmental impact of disposing of the asset when it comes to the end of its life cycle. The Board also believes that where an asset of the School District No. 6 (Rocky Mountain) has been designated as surplus, every effort should be made to dispose of that asset in such a manner that the maximum financial benefit accrues to the School District. The Board, therefore, requires that, where such an asset is deemed to have a market value in excess of \$100.00, it shall be offered for sale to the general public.

However, the Board of Education reserves the right to dispose of an asset by donation, or by any other means it deems appropriate.
