BYLAW:

RIGHT OF APPEAL

- <u>1. The right of appeal is described in Section 11 of the School Act.</u> Where a decision of an employee of the Board of Education (Board) significantly affects the education, health or safety of a student, that student or the parents of the student may <u>aAaAppeal</u> to the Board. <u>T</u>. The failure of an employee to make a decision shall be deemed to be a decision for the purpose of bringing an <u>aaAppeal</u>.
- 2. -It is the position of the Rocky Mountain Board of Education that an aappeal is typically preceded by appropriate efforts to resolve concerns using the problem solving process outlined in policy and practice 9200.
- 3. -The following decisions shall be deemed to significantly affect the education, health, or safety of a student:
 - a) Disciplinary suspension from school for a period in excess of five (5) consecutive days
 - b) Exclusion from school for a health condition
 - c) Placement in an educational program (does not include classroom or teacher placement as determined by the school)
 - d) Grade promotion or graduation
 - e) Refusal to offer educational programming to a non-graduated student sixteen (16) years or <u>older</u>
 - <u>f)</u> Any other decision that significantly impacts the present or future educational programming <u>of a student</u>

INITIATING AN APPEAL

- 2.4. An Aappeal shall be commenced within a reasonable <u>30 calendar days period</u> of the time that the student or parent appealing the decision was informed of the __decision <u>or 30 calendar</u> <u>days following the breakdown of the problem-solving process</u>.
- <u>5.</u> To initiate an <u>a</u>Appeal, the person appealing the decision <u>must</u> complete, sign, date, and deliver the attached Notice of Appeal form to the <u>PrincipalPrincipal</u> of the school attended by the affected student or to the Superintendent of Schools.

4.<u>6.</u>If the person appealing the decision wishes to have an advocate assist him/her through the process, the District will provide assistance in securing an advocate acceptable to the parent o<u>r</u> student.

PRE-HEARING PROCESS

- 7. Upon receipt of the aappeal, the Secretary Treasurer will determine whether the appeal falls within the scope of the decisions considered in Section 3.
- 8. Should the Secretary Treasurer deny the aappeal under this bylaw, the Secretary Treasurer will provide written reasons to the appellant with a copy provided to the Board.
- 9. Should a decision be made to hear the aappeal, the Superintendent will convene a meeting with the appellant to review relevant information to the aappeal. At this meeting the Superintendent:

a) May request the presence of other staff or individuals to assist in clarifying information related to the aappeal.

b) Strive to reach a resolution of the aappeal

c) Keep documentation of the meeting

<u>d)</u> Communicate the resolution in writing to the employee(s) whose decision is under appeal, the appellant, and the Board.

<u>10. Should there be no resolution to the aappeal, the Superintendent will communicate to the</u> Board the appellant's wish to pursue the appeal to a hearing of the Board.

<u>11.</u> All pre-hearing processes and meetings shall be informal and without prejudice and no record or report of them, either oral or written shall be provided to the Board in advance of the Hhearing.

HEARING WITH THE BOARD

<u>12.</u>

- 5. Upon receipt of a Notice of escalating an aAppeal to the Board, the Superintendent shall provide the Notice to the BBoard for:
 - (a) setting of a time, date and place for the <u>h</u>earing of the <u>aa</u>Appeal for making a decision; or
 - (b) giving directions as outlined in Section 6 of this Bylaw.

- 6.13. The Board may decide <u>not</u> to hear the <u>a</u>Appeal:
 - (a) if the <u>aAppeal has not been commenced within a reasonable 30 day period of time;</u> or
 - (b) unless the person appealing the decision first discusses the decision under <u>aappeal</u> with any person or persons as directed by the Board; <u>or</u>
 - (b)(c) The Board determines the appeal is not within the scope of considerations of the Bylaw II and Section 11 of the School Act-
- 7.14. Any direction or decision made by the Board pursuant to Section 6 of this Bylaw and time, date and place set for the <u>h</u>Hearing shall be communicated <u>in writing within 45 business days</u> to the <u>person appealing the decisionappellant and the employee(s)</u> whose decision is being <u>appealed in writing</u>.
- 8. All officers and employees of the Board shall facilitate any meeting directed by the Board as part of the process prior to a Hearing to resolve the matter under appeal.

9. All pre-hearing processes and meetings shall be informal and without prejudice and no record or report of them, either oral or written shall be provided to the Board in advance of the Hearing.

HEARING WITH THE BOARD

10. Subject to Section 6 of this Bylaw, the appeal shall be heard by the Board.

- <u>11.15.</u> At the hearing of the <u>a</u>Appeal, the Superintendent shall advise the Board of the substance of the decision under <u>a</u>Appeal without comment on the reasons, justification for or merits of the decision.
- <u>12.16.</u> The person appealing the decision and the employee whose decision is being appealed may appear and be heard by the Board together and both may address, as the case may be, the merits or otherwise of the decision, the reasons for or against the decision, the appropriateness of the decision in the context and circumstances and such other matters relevant to the <u>a</u>Appeal. Both may also respond to questions put by the Trustees to either of them or to questions and answers put by Trustees to Board officers or others. The Board may, at the hearing, hear from any other persons as it considers desirable.
- <u>17.</u> The School Board may consider an appeal notwithstanding any defect in form or other technical irregularity.

<u>18.</u> <u>14.</u> The Board <u>may will</u> makes its decision at the hearing <u>or as soon as practicableor</u> within <u>45 days</u> and shall advise the <u>person making the Appealappellant and the employee(s)</u> whose decision is under appeal of the decision in writing.

AVENUES BEYOND THE APPEALS PROCESS

<u>19. If the appellant wishes to appeal the Board's decision, the appellant may contact the Superintendent of Appeals under Section 11.2 of the School Act: Appeals to the Superintendent of Appeals.</u>
